## Career Cluster Inventory: By Maria Chavez B2

I took the 80 question survey and it was really cool to see my results. My top three were arts, audio/visual technology, and communications, human services, and architecture and construction. I got 12 for the first two and then 11 for the third.

The description that came along with the arts category was that I would need to use my creativity, talent, and technical skills for my career, this really does sound like me, because I love to perform, express my artwork, animate things, and I am a little bit of a visual learner. Three occupations that I found cool in this category were fashion designer, film and video editors, and writers. Fashion designers need at least an associate degree and they earn \$43,950 per year. Film and video editors need 4 years of college and earn 34,570. Writers need to have at least a bachelor's degree and they earn \$40,050.

In human services I would work with individuals and families to fit their personal needs. This field actually does interest me a lot, and I think the jobs associated with it seem quite enjoyable. Three occupations that interest me are hairstylists and cosmetologists, genetic counselors, and marriage and family therapists. Hairstylists/ cosmetologists need to train from 9- 24 months and need a license. The wage is about \$25,720. Genetic counselors need a master's degree and a license and earn \$63,340. Marriage and family therapists need to have a master's degree, a license, and earn \$52,250.

Lastly, for architecture and construction, I would have to be a very visual and interested in buildings, and I sort of like this a little because I enjoyed working with Google Sketch up. Three occupations that interested me were, wallpaper hangers, architects, and painters. Architects need 5 or more years of college and earn \$68,890. Wallpaper hangers study from 4 months to a year and earn \$24,000 - \$35,999. Lastly, Painters need 2 to three years of education and earn \$34,410.
